At the Erie Women's Fund Summer Celebration, Kathy Stearns, Chair of the Grants Committee, presented a \$100,000 grant to EUMA (Erie United Methodist Alliance) for its Journey Home Project.

This project strives to make homelessness rare by keeping emancipated youth who have aged out of the foster system out of the homeless system. The grant will support the necessary rehabilitation of an eleven-unit anchor building in Erie's West Bayfront Community. This building is home to a supportive living community that fosters stability and independence with the help of resident assistants who provide safety and security.

When did you become an adult?

They are adults and are expected to live independently when they turn 18 and age out of the foster care system. For too many, they instantly lose access to nearly every form of support that they've become used to.

That's why nearly 5,000 will enter the homeless system and suicide is the leading cause of death for unaccompanied homeless youth. Nearly 6,000 will have justice involvement and half will lose custody of their children.

The most effective way of ending homelessness, improving health outcomes and strengthening our community for all is to keep people OUT of the homeless system.

In partnership with Bethesda Lutheran Services, Family Services of NWPA, and faithful EUMA donors like you; we commit to ending homelessness for youth aging out of foster care.

In a letter of support EUMA's project proposal to the Erie Women's Fund, Andrew one of the youth in Journey Home wrote!

"After aging out of the foster care program, I found myself in some really deep waters and tough times. The opportunity that EUMA's Journey Home program offered was a second chance. When I felt severely depressed, I contacted my EUMA resident assistant, Mark. He always showed up for me, served as a mentor and pushes me to do better every single day. Mark and the staff at EUMA, they give me hope."

Last night 13 youth who aged out of foster care were in an EUMA apartment. They were supported by EUMA staff and volunteers committed to helping them transition to adulthood and thanks to you, in a building that will have a new roof, soffit, downspouts, exterior security lighting and a place to meet with their supportive services caseworkers, friends and family in a renovated commercial location and on a trajectory driven by hope in a brighter tomorrow.



As you can see, this newsletter is all about you! We pause and celebrate the time, talent and treasure you have invested in your EUMA.

For 135 years, people just like you have said, "Yes!" to helping Veterans in greatest need. Said, "Yes!" to welcoming those with severe mental illness out of the cold. Said, "Yes!" to keeping youth out of the homeless system. Said, "Yes!" to single Moms and single Dads as they are welcomed onto a pathway to permanent housing

We are pleased to announce that you and 128 riders raised approximately \$15,000. Thank you to all our volunteers and corporate sponsors for making this such a success! Because of you 162 people, including 95 children were sheltered and welcomed onto a pathway to permanent housing.
