Who is collecting shoes:
Why?: To help those who are homeless or with a disability, served by EUMA (Erie United Methodist Alliance) and AGCM (All God's Children Ministries), respectively.
Where do shoes go?: Donated shoes are turned in to Funds2Orgs. EUMA and AGCM receive money (per pound of shoes) to support their programs, unwanted shoes are kept out of landfills, and shoes are sent to support micro-entrepreneurs in developing nations.
How you can help: Collect your gently worn and unwanted new shoes, rubber band pairs together, put them in a garbage bag labeled "Shoe Drive," and leave bag(s) on your curb for pick-up. Shoe Drive Pick-up Day is: from to
