

Our Neighbors' Place Seasonal Overflow Shelter Your Shelter of Last Resort

When all traditional shelter beds are full. When your mental illness is unmanaged and your addiction is out of control. When the wind howls and the rain falls, your EUMA is there. Rotating between communities of faith and the MHA these host locations, EUMA staff and heroes—volunteers welcome our homeless neighbors, as Jesus would at Our Neighbors' Place. A sanctuary to: get in out of the cold, take a hot shower, share a meal, lay down their head, receive welcome and get on to a pathway to permanent housing. On behalf of the 314 guests you sheltered at ONP, thank you. For whatever you have done to the least of these, you have done it to Jesus.

When ONP is full—when guests can't stay inside because of their severe mental illness—you provided over
120 sleeping bags for our unsheltered neighbors. Alex, a young man suffering from schizophrenia and unthinkable trauma struggles to be inside. Your donated sleeping bag was the gift he, and so many of our homeless neighbors needed.



When you PRAY, GIVE and ENGAGE with your EUMA to end homelessness —you change the trajectory of lives. Did you know, that makes you a hero to me and to our homeless neighbors? It does!

Since 1888, tens of thousands of our neighbors: families, single Moms and single Dads, youth aging out of foster care, Veterans and others have received the love, care and support they needed to change the trajectory of their lives.

Update from the CEO OPPORTUNITY FOR CHANGE

I know there are heroes among us! For 133 nights, 314 of our homeless neighbors found shelter at Our Neighbors' Place. Faithful and dedicated volunteers made that happen.

I know there are heroes among us! At the Rainbow Connection Thrift Store volunteers, like Nancy, welcome people donating gently used items and she restocks shelves so our neighbors in need can find the clothes and household goods they need to succeed.

I know there are heroes among us! After experiencing a housing crisis as a single Mom of eight, Consuelo has returned

to EUMA's The Refuge to lead a Bible study!

I know because without you praying and giving of your time, talent and treasure, EUMA could not end homelessness by making it rare, brief and one-time, as Jesus would.

When EUMA's Rainbow Connection Thrift Store volunteer was a child, she remembered many hard times. She remembered her parents struggling to make ends meet. Nancy remembered the days before Christmas and the reality that it was going to be a lean one. "My parents could not afford Christmas presents. Times were tough."

Not all heroes wear capes. However, they do change lives. Days before Christmas, a member of Washington United Methodist Church and dressed like Santa Claus, delivered a car full of

Today, Nancy and EUMA Rainbow staff like Barb Ames, pictured with Nancy, welcome neighbors in need to fill their vouchers. Last year, your EUMA's Rainbow Connection Thrift Store gave 1,638 individuals clothing, shoes,



household goods, furniture and appliances valued at nearly \$58,000—free of charge.

HOMELESS TO HOME! HOPELESS TO HOPE!



"I could never say, 'Thank you!' enough for the way my family was loved and embraced from day one. We didn't even ask. EUMA's The Refuge staff and volunteers walked alongside us the entire way."

From homeless to a home of their own, your EUMA's The Refuge was there. Remember, not all heroes wear capes!

As a child, then as a youth and then as a young adult, with children of her own, Consuelo experienced the trauma, hardships and hopelessness of not having a place to call home.

For years, a permanent home — a place where she and her children could live, learn, grow and dream of a future different than the one they were experiencing, eluded them.

That was until she and her eight children were welcomed at EUMA's The Refuge. Consuelo said, "I was determined to break the cycle of homelessness and provide a better future for my children." That was nearly 30 years ago...

...today, with the addition of a 10th room, heroes like you who pray, give and engage at EUMA's The Refuge are changing lives. The Refuge is a 36 bed emergency shelter for families with children. Staff and volunteers end family homelessness by reducing lengths of stay homeless, increasing permanent housing placements and wrapping families, like Consuelo's, with the supports they need, to end their homelessness, once and for all.

For Consuelo and her children, they found that trajectory-altering start at EUMA's The Refuge. After a lifetime of homelessness, Consuelo encountered heroes who helped her break the generations of chronic homelessness for herself and for the generations that followed!

Heroes like EUMA staff! Consuelo recalled, "I was very nervous about going to the shelter with my eight children. I didn't want to be a bother or get in the way." She said, "I didn't need to worry! My children and I were literally embraced by the EUMA staff and volunteers!"

Heroes like EUMA volunteers! Consuelo remembered she and her children had a beautiful Christmas at The Refuge — one her family will never forget. Of course, there was decorating a Christmas tree, hanging wreaths on the shelter door, adding garland to the fireplace and the excitement when Santa and Mrs. Claus showed up with beautifully wrapped presents for all of the children and adults.

Heroes who were great landlords! Imagine being a single Mom with eight children and a history of homelessness. Consuelo recalled the challenges she faced trying to find a landlord to rent to her. That's why EUMA works to build relationships with and provide landlord-tenant supports to hundreds of households and many dozens of landlords committed to turning their properties into homes for so many of our neighbors in need. That was the case for Consuelo and her eight kids when Alice Hanold, even while expressing concerns, stepped up and welcomed Consuelo and her children into a home of their own.

Heroes who donated household items!

What would you and your eight kids need when moving into a new home? Thanks to those who donate gently used clothes, household items, small and large appliances, furniture and more to EUMA's Rainbow Connection Thrift Store, Consuelo's new home was furnished with items she picked out!

Heroes like Consuelo! A few weeks ago, Consuelo, now a mother of 10 and grandmother, called to ask if she could return to EUMA's The Refuge to start a Bible Study — a time of fellowship, a time she can share her story and stand with her neighbors working to end their homelessness, once and for all!

And, heroes like you! Know, by the way you PRAY, GIVE and ENGAGE with your EUMA, you are ending homelessness for Consuelo and nearly 400 households each year, right here in NW PA and just as Jesus would!

We agree with Consuelo: We could never say, Thank you' enough. Friends, since Consuelo moved into their own home, not a single day of homelessness has been experienced by Consuelo, her ten children or 21 grandchildren.

Last night, ten families including 13 adults and 17 children found a place of refuge. Last year, EUMA's The Refuge provided 50 households, 162 individuals totaling 9,690 bednights — a place in which, with the help of heroes like you, they can move from homeless to HOME — hopeless to HOPE in a brighter tomorrow!
