



Dear Refuge Tournament Golfers,

For 29 years, homeless families have been able to count on golfers like you to provide them a place to stay while they get on a pathway to permanent housing. I ask you to continue your assistance by participating in EUMA's 29th Annual Refuge Emergency Shelter Golf Tournament which will be held Monday, June 16, 2025 at Riverside Golf Course, 25437 Route 19, just north of Cambridge Springs.

EUMA's The Refuge, an emergency shelter for homeless families with children, is changing the trajectory of lives. The Refuge allows entire families to stay together, including fathers and multiple generations during their length of stay. In 2024 alone, The Refuge ended homelessness for 122 families, including 68 children! Thanks to you and our sponsors, we raised \$27,000 at last year's tournament to support homeless families.

The registration cost is \$90 per person (\$360/foursome). Registration begins at 10 AM, and the shotgun start is set for 11:00 AM. This will be a four-person scramble without handicaps and will include various skill prizes. A light lunch will be provided at the start and we will end with a picnic style dinner. A 36-bed emergency shelter in Erie County offers a safe haven for families during their housing crisis, ensuring that the entire family—grandparents, fathers, and children—can stay together.

The shelter accommodates up to ten families at a time, with each family having their own private room. Thanks to your support, we've grown from a 32-bed capacity serving nine families to this expanded facility!

EUMA Staff meet guest where they are at an assist families in their progress toward selfsufficiency and permanent housing. We provide the necessities such as daily shelter, clothing, food, and personal supplies.

Then we implement case manager work to link families to community resources such as: employment, assistance to stabilize income/benefits, education - adult & children.
